Dear Friends,

Most pastors and congregations find it increasingly difficult to identify, nurture and encourage disciples. When members of the Nominations team call someone to serve on the council or a ministry team, they hear “no” far more often than “yes.” And when members are asked to assist with small tasks, such as ushering or greeting, making coffee or packing up quilts, our members often tell us they are out of town that weekend, or they just want to sit in the pew, or they aren’t any good at that kind of thing or. . . any number of other reasons to decline.

How do we make sense out of this reluctance to serve? Church experts give us many reasons. Certainly many of us have over stretched and overwhelmed ourselves with so many activities we feel justified in saying no to one more. Some of us live for the weekends, purchasing campers, following sports teams, and taking long weekend vacations. We have made our commitments and can’t be in two places at the same time. And still others tell us that as our culture becomes more and more consumer based, people are looking for churches who provide services, but do not expect service. And let’s face it, some of us just don’t want to be bothered.

I think this reluctance to be a disciple and to serve God’s church is more pronounced today because our culture has become increasingly secularized. But we should also remember that long before there were Sunday morning hockey games, Wednesday night pep rallies, and traveling sports teams, there were plenty of reluctant prophets and clueless disciples in the Bible too. They resisted God’s call quite often.

When God called Moses to go to the Pharaoh and demand that he free the Israelites from slavery, Moses offered many excuses: “But who am I?” and “What if Pharaoh doesn’t believe me?” and even, “I am not eloquent but slow of speech.” Nevertheless God persisted. He gave Moses the power to work miracles and an assistant (Aaron) to be his mouthpiece. Moses didn’t get away. He served and was blessed for his ministry.

And who can forget Jonah? God told him “‘Arise, go to Nineveh and cry against it; for their wickedness has come before me.’” But Jonah rose to flee from the presence of the Lord. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish; so he paid the fare, and went on board, away from the presence of the Lord.” (Jonah 1:1-3). God asked Jonah to travel in one direction and Jonah traveled in the exact opposite. Jonah tried to hide. But as you know, God still had the last word. He sent a whale to swallow Jonah, the whale threw Jonah up on another beach, and Jonah finally learned he could not escape God’s call. He did what God asked and the people of Nineveh were saved.

And there are many others too. . . Sarah who laughed at God’s promises, Miriam who not only refused to follow God’s direction but actually led the Israelites to worship an idol, the widow of Zapheth who asked Elijah to go away and just let her and her son die, and Nathanael who was called by Jesus to follow and who replied sarcastically, “Can anything good come out of Nazareth?”

So we are not alone if we feel ill-prepared or disinterested or too busy with other things. Many men and women have also procrastinated, made excuses, and felt unworthy. But the really good thing is that God does not give up on us. God continues to call, nudge, persuade, ask, and encourage us. God knows that our service not only prospers his church, it also builds us to be more loving and giving human beings. God may accept us as we are, whether we serve the church or not, but never leaves us where we are. God is about making disciples and he will make it happen. So the next time someone asks you to serve our congregation, please consider saying yes. You don’t hold a chance against God!



## **Lent 2019: For the Least of These**

Lent begins very soon. On Wednesday, March 6, we will gather for Ash Wednesday worship at 6:15 pm. We will hear God's call for us to repent, we will remember our mortality with the mark of ashes on our foreheads, and gather at the table to receive food and drink to sustain us in the 40-day Lenten journey. Please do not neglect this very important worship service.

After Ash Wednesday, our Lenten series (for both Sundays and Wednesdays) will focus on acts of love for "The Least of These." Performing acts of love is one of the classic Lenten disciplines. Giving this love to the "least of these" was defined in Jesus' parable of the Sheep and the Goats where God says: *"Come, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me."*

Using these words as our manual for performing acts of love and shaping our devotion, we will focus on the hungry, the thirsty, the strangers, the sick, and the imprisoned. Each week will include worship services written by the pastors with special attention to one of the groups; Wednesday noon lunches where we will talk about how we fit into each of these groups, if not materially, then spiritually; and weekly collections of gifts for each vulnerable group. Please note the following schedule:

### **Week One: March 10-16 – The Hungry**

We will listen to the story of Elijah and the widow of Zarephath and Isaiah's call to come, buy and eat. We will receive special visits from a pet goat and will collect offerings for ELCA Hunger to purchase goats for hungry people around the world.

### **Week Two: March 17-23 – The Thirsty**

We will study the story of the Woman at the Well and remember Jesus' words that anyone who gives a cup of cold water to one of God's little ones will receive their reward. We will collect offerings to purchase family water filtration systems for the poor through Lutheran World Relief.

### **Week Three: March 24-30 – The Stranger**

We will study Old Testament commandments and instructions on how to treat the resident aliens who live among us and we will look at the Parable of the Great Dinner where the host invites outsiders to a great feast. We will also collect toiletries for refugee families through Lutheran Social Services.

**Week Four: March 31-April 6 – The Sick**

We will study the healing of the Gerasene Demoniac and the Ten Lepers and collect flat white twin-size bedsheets for Global Health Ministries. They will be dispersed to missionary hospitals as bedding or as rolled bandages.

**Week Five: April 7-13 – The Imprisoned**

We will study Isaiah's promise to send a deliverer who will proclaim liberty to the captives and the story of how Paul and Silas sang their way out of prison. For our offerings this week we will provide assistance to Ministry on the Margins (MOM), which serves those who have recently left prison. We will prepare breakfast for the clients on Tuesday, April 9 and we will work in the MOM food pantry on Thursday, April 11. We will also collect items for the food pantry throughout the week.

Watch Sunday morning bulletins and our Facebook page for additional information. Lenten dinners will soon be announced. More specific lists of items to be donated/collected will soon be forthcoming. And we will provide sign up sheets for those who wish to volunteer at MOM.

- Doug addressed projects completed in December including the replacement of one of the thermostats in the sanctuary and completion of the annual inspection of the fire extinguishers. Doug also purchased a battery charger for the van, and the committee encouraged the purchase of an additional Roomba for daily use in the fellowship hall.
- Installation of a stability bar/support pole in the handicapped bathroom was completed. The committee also discussed the plan by Youth & Family Ministry to paint a wall and install a new TV in the youth room. All agreed that it will be an excellent upgrade to our space for youth, and it was suggested the TV be mounted on the south wall rather than using a portable cart.
- Sound panels for the fellowship hall have been invoiced and paid. A final decision on color will be made soon, and we will ask for help from the congregation to complete installation when the panels arrive.

- Discussed the need for an additional monitoring camera for the kitchen. Will get a quote and discuss funding. Also discussed receiving \$835 from the Endowment Committee as well as matching funds from a member for the installation of automatic doors at the kitchen entrance. Will explore funding ideas for the additional \$2800 required to pay for the project.
