Dear Friends,

I don't know about you, but I am ready for summer. It has been a long time in coming this year. I am ready for warmer temps and sunshine, to be sure, but even more importantly for the different pace from the rest of the year. A bit slower. More relaxed. Fewer meetings. Time away from the usual routines.

As we turn towards summer, I find myself thinking about the tradition of Sabbath. Consider these words from Exodus: *Then God spoke all these words: I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; you shall have no other gods before me. . . Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. Six days you shall labor and do your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work – you, your son or your daughter, your male or female slave, your livestock, or the alien resident in your towns. For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore the Lord blessed the sabbath day and consecrated it. (Ex. 20:1-2, 8-11)*

These verses, as you may know, come from the 10 Commandments, the central portion of the law meant to govern the life of the Jewish people. And as I reflect on the passage, I am thinking:

*How I am pretty good with the rest of the 10 commandments – I haven't killed anyone. I have never committed adultery. I only covet a little bit. But still, I am pretty lousy with the Sabbath.

*Or, the differences in our communities and our families from when I was growing up and everything was closed on Sundays to now when we count on stores and services to be available 7 days a week; 365 days a year.

*Or to the pressure put on our lives when we are expected or feel like we are expected to be available to others 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Many of my colleagues feel this is essential and balk at the idea that I do not carry a cell phone and refuse to text. I beg to differ.

Remember the sabbath and keep it holy.

If we are truly going to observe Sabbath, I think we need to observe summertime in a new way. How do we replenish our energy and renew our creativity so we are not simply trapped by the next thing on our "to-do" list? What if instead of thinking about the upcoming couple of months as summer, or your upcoming time away as vacation, what if you thought about it and approached it as *sabbath*? As time you intentionally carve out from the busyness and business of life as it usually is. To live differently. To bring a different attitude and outlook to the moment you have. To look at your life and the time of your life as a gift. And, then to see what happens.

Remember the sabbath and keep it holy.

And how about keeping it holy? It is not just about *sabbath*, is it? It is about keeping the sabbath *holy*. That does not mean down on your knees or spending the entire summer in church. But, to some extent it does. Maybe it means using these days to intentionally cultivate a deeper sense of gratitude, to say thank you more often than you complain or shake your head or point your finger. Maybe it means going at a pace which enables you to pay enough attention that you notice those things that surprise you with grace or take away your breath with beauty. Maybe it is slowing down long enough that you notice the many, many ways that God brushes up against your life.

Remember the sabbath and keep it holy.

I hope we will. I hope I will see you in church as we rest and reflect together. God bless! - Pastor Nadine



Finding Financial Peace

Do you feel the weight of debt holding you back from fully enjoying your life and meeting your goals? The course will provide you with very practical ideas for managing your money, setting goals and making measurable progress.

The course sessions are led by Dave Ramsey, author of seven books on financial peace and founder of "The Dave Ramsey Show" which is heard by more than 13 million listeners each week. He is known to offer hope, through various means, to anyone who wants to better understand the principles of proper money management. Assisting Ramsey are Rachel Cruze, the #1 best selling author of 3 books on personal finance, and Chris Hogan, an expert in retirement planning.

Sponsored by the Lord of Life Stewardship Team, Financial Peace University will be offered on Sunday mornings this Fall, beginning on Sept. 15. The course will be facilitated by Lord of Life member Jordan Nygaard. Jordan graduated from UND with a degree in Banking and Financial Management. He has also worked as a financial advisor with Eide Bailey and now works in the same capacity for Edward Jones.

Understanding the Bible and Changing Your Life

Every Sunday we gather in worship and read together passages of scripture. But these passages often seem like "sound bytes," which give us only one little window into a much larger and more meaningful picture of God's work in the world.

Enter the Crossways Bible study program. Crossways is a comprehensive two-year program which introduces students to an overview of the entire Bible. Students become familiar with a clear timeline behind the scriptures, themes that hold together throughout the entire canon of scripture, and a number of insights that will change most people's understanding of who God is and how God works in our lives. Participants will read what is familiar but also many materials that are less known but just as inspiring. People who take the course consistently speak of how thorough and helpful the course is in helping them to "get the big picture." The course has changed many lives and awakened a genuine curiosity in thousands of people who want to dive deeper into their faith.

Crossways will begin at Lord of Life on Wednesday evenings in the Fall. Each session will run from 7 pm to 8:15 pm, making it perfect for adults whose children are in Wednesday School or Confirmation. Generous breaks will be taken according to the public school calendar. Materials for the 2 years will not exceed \$25 for anyone. If you wish to enroll in the course, please call the church office or visit with Pastor Nadine. At least 12 students are needed in order to offer the course. Non-members are welcome to attend as well so invite your friends, siblings, neighbors, cousins, parents, etc. Registration ends on August 20.

COUNCIL MINUTES
May 14, 2019**

Call to Order: President Jim Gray called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Council Members Present: President Jim Gray, Secretary Roxanne Gardner, Karl Carlson – Property & Maintenance, Crystal Engel - Volunteerism, Mark Swenson – Worship & Music, Bob Salveson – Nominations & Placement, Dennis Steele – Evangelism, Bud Reiner – Financial Stewardship, Lark Welch – Youth

Absent: Vice President Linda Simmons, Craig Nelson - Education

Staff Members Present: Pastor Nadine Lehr, Pastor Beth Walch

Devotions: Bud Reiner led devotions.

Announcements by President Gray.

- The council member packets contain a document that shows the Dedicated/Restricted Accounts for each team.
- Reid Halvorson has been hired as the Youth Director. Since he is a music teacher at Shiloh Christian School during the school year, his hours will be full time during the months of June, July, and August and 25 hours a week for the remaining months. He will continue as the AV coordinator.

Minutes of the April Meeting: Bob Salveson moved to approve these minutes.

Crystal Engel moved to second the motion. There was no discussion, motion carried.

Financial Report: April income was \$61,241.97 compared to \$46,309.96 in expenses, resulting in a yearly income increase of \$9,531.81. Projected income at the end of April based on our approved budget is \$217,441.00, meaning our actual income is \$21,919.98 less than budgeted income. The general envelope giving is \$2381.27 behind 2018. Bud Reiner stated that in the fall his team will request the transfer of reserve funds from the church money market and passbook accounts at Capital Credit Union to a cash obligations fund through Edward Jones. This fund is currently paying 2.2% more than these accounts are currently receiving.

Team, Pastor and Staff Reports: Council members were provided with hard copies of team reports. Dennis Steele motioned to accept these reports. Seconded by Bob Salveson. Motion carried.

Old Business

- A. Discussion on Reconciling in Christ congregations
 - Some Pros discussed – provide a unique branding of our congregation, adopt a position, might welcome other groups in as well
 - Some Cons discussed – losing members because of division, reopen old wounds, by being specifically inclusive would we exclude others?
 - We could possibly make our welcome statement more inclusive. Bob Salveson will put together examples of other congregations' welcome statements. The consensus from the council is to take baby steps towards this issue. Further discussion to follow.
- B. Revisiting the Cash Reserve Policy – Bud Reiner

This policy was included in the March packets.

 - We have waived the policy the past two years. Should the policy exist? Should it be more of a guideline?
 - Bud Reiner motioned to rescind the Cash Reserve Policy. Karl Carlson seconded this motion. Discussion followed. As a guideline instead of a policy there will be more flexibility. Teams would need to budget for upcoming large projects. The largest money needs are Property and Staff. Vote taken and motion carried. The Cash Reserve Policy is rescinded, it will be used for guideline purposes only.
- C. Discussion on street-side banner – Dennis Steele
 - Dennis Steele stated the measurements would need to be 92" x 80". A few estimates were found that were less than \$200.
 - Since there is also discussion on our logo, theme, trademark, brand, etc., a committee will be set up to discuss this. Pastor Beth has spoken to several creative members that are interested in serving on this committee. Evangelism team has discussed this and have members to invite. Pastor Beth is willing to convene this committee. Pastor Nadine will also be involved.
- D. Updating the Van Use Policy – Karl Carlson
 - Still a work in progress.

New Business

- A. Identifying delegates to the WND Synod Assembly June 7-8 in Minot
 - Secretary Roxanne Gardner has volunteered to attend
 - No other council members are interested so the invitation will be open to congregational members.
- B. Travel Policy for Lord of Life employees
 - Note section 8.2 regarding car rental. Discussion involved how we can be covered when transporting a group of youth at youth gatherings and so forth. More information to follow.
- C. Team issues request to be brought to the Council

Education Team – what would it take to complete the elevator?

 - Discussion tabled due to Craig Nelson's absence.
- D. Property Team
 - Electronic locks have been installed but are not functional yet except for the kitchen door. With electronic locks, staff do not need to be at the church to unlock/lock doors. These can be programmed. Security

cameras will be placed in needed areas to enhance the system already in place. Would having lights come on be a theft/break-in deterrent?

- E. Crystal Engel asked what the results of the church fundraisers are. Pastor Beth and Jessica have discussed reporting this information to the congregation.

Visioning

- A. Brainstorming on "How" Statement #3: *"We will offer biblically based educational opportunities for all ages."*
- With Craig Nelson being absent, and the Education team being a large part of this discussion, we will discuss this statement at the June meeting.
 - Also, for June, discuss "How" Statement #4: *"We will be committed and supportive of our church family, deliberately loving and helping one another."*
- B. The ideas coming from these sessions are to be taken back and used as guidelines for things each team can do as time, people to be involved and money are available.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.


